**P.S** Just an after thought.

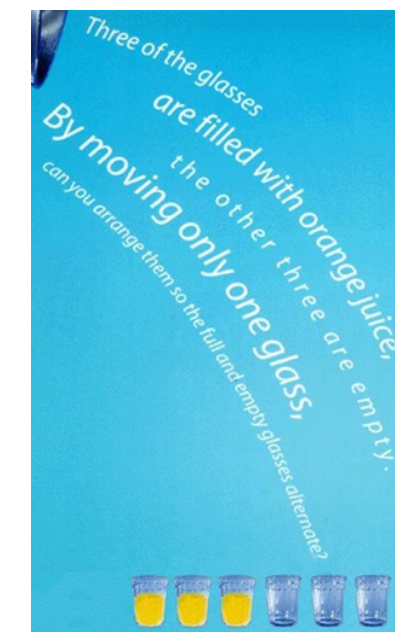
