One of our keen readers - Barrie Searles asked if we could find out more about singer/songwriter Pam Clarke.

So I contacted Pam, and here's what she had to say...

Raised in the outback of NSW my introduction to entertaining was playing the Pianola and singing to the stock agents at a very young age. At age 11 I appeared on Channel Nine's "Joanne Priest Show", and at 13 recorded a 45 rpm vinyl at radio station 5AD. The latter years at school often saw me in trouble for singing and playing popular songs rather than knuckling down to piano practice. I eventually



moved further north into the remote outback after marrying, working as station hand among many other jobs. I'd always had the desire to sing, but living in such a remote area, felt little hope of pursuing my interest in music. A lady taught me to yodel over the telephone, and the first song I ever wrote was about giving it my best shot for a talent quest I entered; however much of the inspiration for my song-writing came out of the bush based on true events. One of my more serious songs, "Upon Reflection" was written following my daughter being involved in an accident. Then there was, "An Outback Woman's Lot" – a tribute to women in the bush. Other events in my life have found their way into songs such as my signature song, "An Aussie Female Shearer Who Became a Queensland Cop". "The Big Turn On" – a tongue in cheek look at the upgrading of life style

after being connected to the Rural Grid Power, and "When the Bushie Wed the Schoolie", - absolute chaos at my son's wedding.

Meeting a lead guitarist in 1990, a duo was formed. And for many years we played for gymkhanas, in many a pub and number of Clubs. I became a regular solo artist at the Mildura CM Festival; recorded my first CD in 1991, and later travelled to Adelaide to do my first major recording in 1995 and again in '98. Throughout this time and the ensuing years I toured with my husband as a one person band, successfully juggling two lives as a singer-entertainer and partner in primary production.

Needing a life style change, my husband, Bryan and I moved to Qld in 2003 where I recorded my fourth CD, "*Diamonds & Jewels*". Knowing only family up here, we could never have imagined the many friendships that would grow from one day at-

tending a Country Music Club.

I also regularly entertain at Senior Citizens Associations; and on several occasions have played the lovely grand piano at the Caloundra Events Centre. Being involved in several country music clubs sees me enjoying interaction with the bands, playing keys and recently, my new and 5th CD album, "I Love Music" was released and is currently receiving airplay both nationally and internationally.

I loved reading your great newsletter... It's one of the best I've seen, and is full of interest. It sounds like you have a really good Club going there.





When Glen Campbell Felt His Mind Was Leaving Him, He Wrote One Last Song to His Loving Wife

Legendary singer and songwriter Glen Campbell has been battling Alzheimer's disease for years, and is now in the final stages of the disease. Campbell has been moved to 24-hour care, as his doctors have determined that he is in the sixth stage of Alzheimer's ('severe cognitive decline').

It has been nearly two years since Campbell has performed in public - however, as a farewell to his music career, Campbell's record label has released his final studio recording.

His final ballad is called "I'm Not Gonna Miss You." The melody is sombre and contemplative, but the lyrics show Campbell's ability to find irony in his disease. The result is a beautiful combination of sadness and joy, which ends much too quickly.

SLIM DUSTY'S FORGOTTEN GOLDEN GUITAR

It might be surprising for Slim Dusty fans to learn that the number of Golden Guitars won by the legendary Australian, Slim Dusty, has increased from 37 to 38, despite the fact that Slim died some 12 years ago in 2003. In fact, neither Slim nor his music, has won another of the prized trophies presented in Tamworth each year in January. It's simply a matter of rectifying a mistake that was made in the statistics many decades ago.

The inaugural Australasian Country Music Awards were staged by Radio 2TM in the Tamworth Town Hall on a very hot Sunday night on January 28th 1973. The initial Award that compere Kevin Knapp announced that historic night was for APRA Song of The Year. To present the Award, well known composer, George Dasey (They're a Weird Mob), was invited to the stage and he presented the first ever Golden Guitar to Joy McKean for her composition "Lights On The Hill".

For many years Slim has been credited for winning only two Golden Guitars at those first Awards in 1973. One was for the Best EP or Single (Lights on the Hill) and another for the Best 12" LP Album (Me And My Guitar). But, recently, Joy McKean and Anne Kirkpatrick have been going through the collection of Slim memorabilia, preparing it for the move to The Slim Dusty Centre in Kempsey later this year, and discovered an extra Golden Guitar from 1973 and were puzzled about it. They wondered if it could be a duplicate they had acquired for some reason.

As a person who contributed so much to Australian country music, Slim deserves all the recognition and thanks we can give him.

However, after checking a rare tape recording of the first Awards in 1973, from the Tamworth Sound and Film Archive, it was discovered that Slim had also been awarded a Golden Guitar as the artist who sang Joy's Best Composition, (Lights On The Hill). So now we know that Slim won three Golden Guitars in January 1973, and not the two that had been counted previously. Things changed considerably in later presentations; 2TM dropped the Golden Guitar for the singer of the Best Composition and also, Golden Guitars given to winning record companies were dropped.

With the Slim Dusty Centre in Kempsey nearing completion, it is appropriate that the great Slim Dusty is now credited with the third forgotten trophy he won in 1973, bringing his grand total up to 38 Golden Guitars awards, unmatched to date.

Commenting on the change, the Secretary of the Country Music Association of Australia, Meryl Davis said, "It's great to see Slim's tally of Golden Guitars being updated. As a person who contributed so much to Australian country music, Slim deserves all the recognition and thanks we can give him. It will be exciting to see the Golden Guitars he won, on display in the Slim Dusty Centre."

All of Slim's 38 Golden Guitars awards will be on display in a special feature at the Slim Dusty Museum in Kempsey when it opens in October this year.





"I've been married to your sister for over 48 years."




