FIONA'S TUCKERBOX-cont.

NUTS AND BOLTS

I don't know the origin of this recipe but I know there are several variations of it around and some people may call it by another name, but this is basically a trail mix and it can last for weeks in an air tight container. This is something I remember my Dad making and we'd just nibble on it until it was gone. It's very addictive.

- 1 290g packet Nutrigrain
- 1 375g packet Sultanas
- 1 375g packet Salted Peanuts
- 1 packet dry cream of chicken soup mix
- 1 packet dry French onion soup mix
- 2 table spoons curry powder
- ¼ cup vegetable oil

Put all the dry ingredients in a really large container that has a lid.

Shake around to mix together.

Add the oil and shake vigorously to combine. (This makes all the dry powdered ingredients stick to the Nutrigrain, sultanas and peanuts)

Stir with a spoon if needed.

This tastes really nice straight away, but tastes even better the next day.

Store in an air tight container. Put small amounts in zip lock bags for on the go snack.
