Club History Snapshot from Year 1996

April saw Southern Skies as the entertainment, and it was Joni Lee's last newsletter. The proposed Craig Giles Cabaret was cancelled due to lack of support.

The May edition with a new editor, Terry Lester, saw a new clean and well laid out look to the newsletter. Country Mile was that month's entertainment.

June's feature entertainment was Bill Bedford's "Country Roundup". June walk-up entertainers were Dennis Verran, Bob Edwards and Annette Ramsay.

July Murray Mac and True Grit were on offer as that month's entertainment. Someone we all know well Keith Warren joined the committee.

August had Trish Wilson and Midnight Mountain Blue as the entertainment.

For September Kerry Ellen who was supported by The Rodeo Cowboys were the entertainment.

October Country Rebels were the entertainment on offer, Brenton and Ann Moar stepped down from the Committee and Helen Warren (I think I know her!) joined the committee. The Newsletter presentation showed the loss of the Moars quite dramatically.

November there was no club show as the Gawler Country Music festival was being held.



If you don't have any coins, Bruce (at the entry door) might be able to help you change over a note to coins. There is also the bar located to the left of the kitchen where you can purchase your cold drinks from.

Most months I have left over food (I don't like to run out so I tend to have more than I should) I will always put the leftovers into take away containers and sell them off cheap, usually from \$5 each. So, if you'd like a no fuss dinner to take home, come and see me around 2pm to grab yours. I can put your name on them and leave in the fridge for you to take home at the end of the show.
