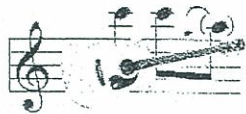

A year after the winning numbers were drawn, the \$23.2 million prize has still not been claimed. You have six years to lodge your claim..... so don't hang about.

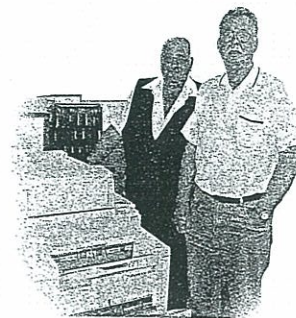
Yes, OK you don't need the money..... and you're worried that your line dancing friends at Gawler Country Music Club will reject you.....
