


## Country Stage Coach!

## Following Smoky's Tracks

No doubt most **Country fans** will already have heard that **Australia's founder of Country Music... Smoky Dawson, the world's oldest recording artist**, passed away on the **13th February 2008** after a short illness, aged 94.

**Smoky** was farewelled on **Feb 20th 2008** at a private and simple funeral in Sydney. A group of 60 family and friends gathered at the Artarmon Uniting Church in Sydney's north to say goodbye.

Among guests at the intimate service were businessman **Dick Smith**, rocker **Jimmy Barnes**, retired broadcaster **John Laws** and many leading **country music** figures.

In an interview in 1994, **Smoky**, who is survived by his wife **Dot**, said he wanted to be remembered as an **"ordinary bloke"** who brought some goodness into the world.

**Smoky** was raised in the **Victorian town of Warrnambool**. His mother and brother died while he was at a young age.

After his mother's death, he was placed in a **Melbourne orphanage** due to the beatings he received from his father.

Later in life, **Smoky** said the experience inspired him to want to do well for himself. He first began performing his songs on radio in the **1930's** and recorded his **first album in 1941**, before joining the **Army's Australian Entertainment Unit in World War II**.

**Smoky** flew to the **US** to sign a record deal and performed at the prestigious **Grand Old Opry**. He returned to **Australia** to become a famous radio star.

**Smoky** wowed audiences with his 'on-stage' performance which included **whip-cracking and axe-throwing**.  
**Memories linger. Smoky R.I.P.**

## Cheese and Salad Sandwich

Food for fit and healthy kids

**Serving size:** Serves 4

**Preparation time:** Less than 15 minutes

### INGREDIENTS

200g low-fat cottage cheese  
1/3 cup coarsely-grated reduced-fat cheddar cheese  
1 cup baby spinach leaves, shredded  
1 green onion, thinly sliced  
1 small carrot, grated  
1 tablespoon roasted sesame seeds  
1 teaspoons lemon juice  
30g Mesclun (A mix of assorted small, young salad leaves)  
8 slices wholemeal bread

### METHOD

Combine cottage cheese, cheddar cheese, baby spinach leaves, green onion, small carrot, roasted sesame seeds and 2 teaspoons lemon juice in medium bowl. Sandwich 30g mesclun and cheese mixture between 8 slices of wholemeal bread.

## The Story of Tamworth (cont.)

**2TM** ran the famous **Bi-Centenary Show in 1970** which re-introduced artists like **Smoky Dawson, Shirley Thoms and Billy Blinkhorn**.

The posters all said **"Worth driving 100 miles to see!"** Again the response was excellent.

As a result of the success and amazing reaction to **Hoedown, the concerts and other factors**, a group of people at **2TM, Warwick Higginbotham, Eric Scott, Kevin Knapp, John Minson and Max Ellis** (presenter of this article) conceived the idea of marketing **Tamworth** as an **Australian Centre for Country Music**.

**Eric Scott** had already located **Hadley Records** in the city and his recording studio and label became an important element in the development of the project.

Prior to this, **Ross Murphy's Opal Records** had already started in **Tamworth**. Later, **Lindsay Butler's LBS** and several others continued the recording contribution.

In **1969, Tamworth** was declared the **'Country Music Capital'** in all promotional activity by the radio station.

Despite the fact that virtually the only substance to the title was the **'Hoedown' radio program, our concerts and Hadley Records...** the name and concept caught on... and our reputation grew. We were ready for the next step. **The Awards!**

In **1972**, after **Johnny Ashcroft** had made a suggestion at a **Gold Record** presentation at an earlier **2TM** concert, plans were made for an awards scheme for **Country Music Songwriters and Recording Artists**, and on January 28<sup>th</sup>, **1973, the first Australasian Country Music Awards were staged** in the **Tamworth Town Hall** in front of a significant number of industry people.

**Joy McKean** won then first **Golden Guitar** ever, **Slim** won his first two.

The Awards were scheduled on the **January long weekend** for several reasons. Firstly, January was a quiet business and operational time for **2TM**. Secondly, the long weekend at the end of the school holidays was judged to be an ideal time for travellers. And there was already **The Amateur Country Music Talent Quest** which had been run for some years by the organisation, which eventually became the **Capital Country Music Association (CCMA)**.
