Golden Greats of Country Music

TROY Cassar-Daley recently had his hands full trying to hang on to the Golden Guitars he won the night before while shaking hands with fans. The singer from Grafton was a popular winner at the annual Country Music Awards in Tamworth, adding four trophies to the 21 he has amassed during his career.

These latest ones were particularly special for him, he says, because the songs that earned them were inspired by the tough times. Cassar-Daley began writing his album Home after the Queensland floods two years ago. The singer, now based in Brisbane, also has a family farm in Queensland that was affected by the floods. "Home was written on a lot of raw emotion, having seen what so many people had gone through near our farm."

Cassar-Daley won male artist of the year and album of the year for **Home**, while the title track was named the song of the year and another song from the album, **Country Is**, took single of the year. Other winners included singer **Catherine Britt**, female artist of the year for **Charlestown Road**, and siblings the **McClymonts**, who won top-selling album (for **Two Worlds Collide**) and video of the year.
