The singer-songwriter, best known for larrikin party songs about bars and trucks, has sold more than 35 million albums and had 31 US No 1 country-music singles over his two-decade career. He was named **Billboard Country Artist of the Decade**.



Keith, 52, will take his **Hammer Down Under** tour to **Brisbane, the NSW Hunter Valley, Sydney and Melbourne**.

The tour will be the first time Keith has performed in Australia. Tickets are on sale now!

His songs include **Should've Been A Cowboy, I Love This Bar, Beer For My Horses** and **As Good As I Once Was**.

He also runs a chain of Toby Keith's **I Love This Bar & Grill** restaurants in the US.

Australian tour promoters Rob Potts Entertainment Edge, Chugg Entertainment and Foxtel's Country Music Channel (CMC) say Australian audiences respond to Keith's larrikin streak and the way he doesn't take himself too seriously.


Keith will also perform songs from his **new album, Drinks After Work**, to be released on November 1.

Reservation Tickets/Stickers if required are available on the day.

Unfortunately, some of our patrons and club members expect to have 'their seat' at every show even when they have not booked in advance. Placing jackets or bags on seats to reserve them for a friend is forbidden.

Put simply, to reserve seats they must be paid for in advance on the day.

We apologise for having to introduce such drastic measures but hopefully by using common sense and respect, such arguments and conflict can be avoided.

We have always been recognised as a friendly club, and we want to keep it that way.
