### COUNTRY MUSIC SHOWCASE SHOWDOWN

It is the intention of the Renmark Lions Club to host a Showcase Showdown of the best Country Music Clubs in Australia.

To enable us to make this event a reality, we encourage your Club to participate in a wonderful fun event over the third weekend of March 1994 - Friday 18th, Saturday 19th and Sunday 20th to be held on the Renmark Oval complex. This will coincide with the 30th anniversary of the Lions Club of Renmark (March 1964 - 1994), and we hope you will help us celebrate this event.

In an effort to encourage Country Music Clubs to strive for excellence, and to encourage juniors to participate in musical events, the competition will be of 1000 points maximum score.

Your band will be the back-up for your vocalists, and part of the team. You may enter more than one team, provided however that the band, vocalists, etc. are not part of team "A". Six judges will preside over events, with a minimum of four at any one time. Team participants will come from the normal home Club only. This will avoid any unfair advantage or friction in the case of some artists being members of more than one Club.

A first prize cheque of \$5000 will be given to the winning Club or team on a "winner take all" basis. Individual trophies will be awarded for the best in each category, based on the number of points scored.

### DEAR MEMBERS & FRIENDS,




