THURSDAY, 20th JANUARY, 1994 — Depart Gawler Bus Depot 6 a.m. travelling via Renmark, Mildura, Hay, West Wylong for dinner, bed and breakfast at Colonial Motor Inn Motel.

FRIDAY, 21st JANUARY — 8 a.m. depart West Wylong Motel, travel via Parkes, Dubbo, Coonabarabran, arriving at the Royal Hotel, Manilla, which will be our accommodation and cooked breakfast for the next eight nights until Sunday, 30th January.

Approx. 6.30 p.m. we depart our hotel for Tamworth to the official opening and concert at Bicentennial Park. After concert we return by our air-conditioned coach to Royal Hotel, **Manilla.** Hotel has no air-conditioning and bathroom is situated down the passage.

Each day of our stay at Manilla we will depart after breakfast for Tamworth. Our return departure time will be announced each morning on the coach. In Tamworth there is an hourly circular bus service which caters for visiting tourists to various venues. The actual programme will not be printed until early December, 1993. A copy will be sent to each passenger before Christmas.


Members Door Prize, a Barrel of Chicken, donated by K.F.C. was won by MAX CRISPIN.
