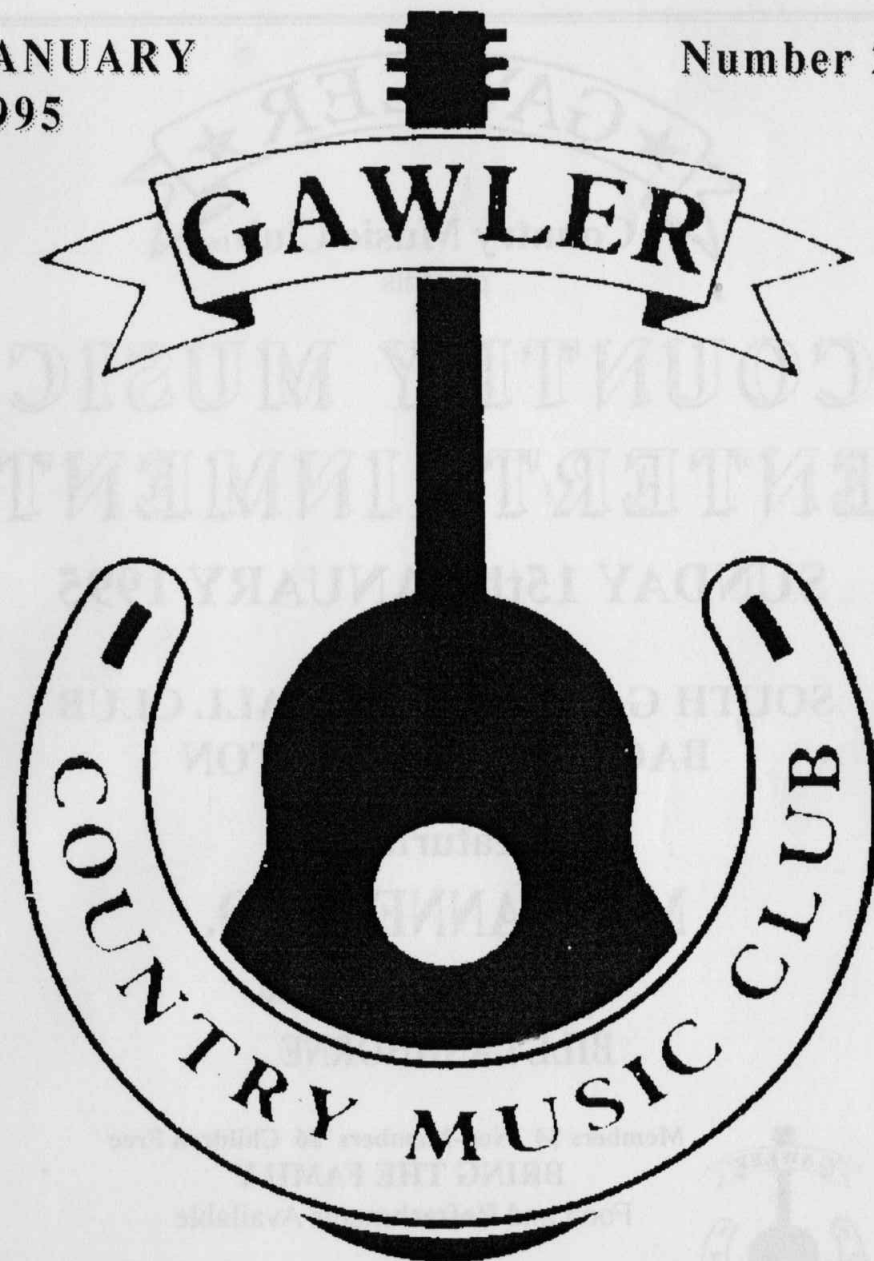

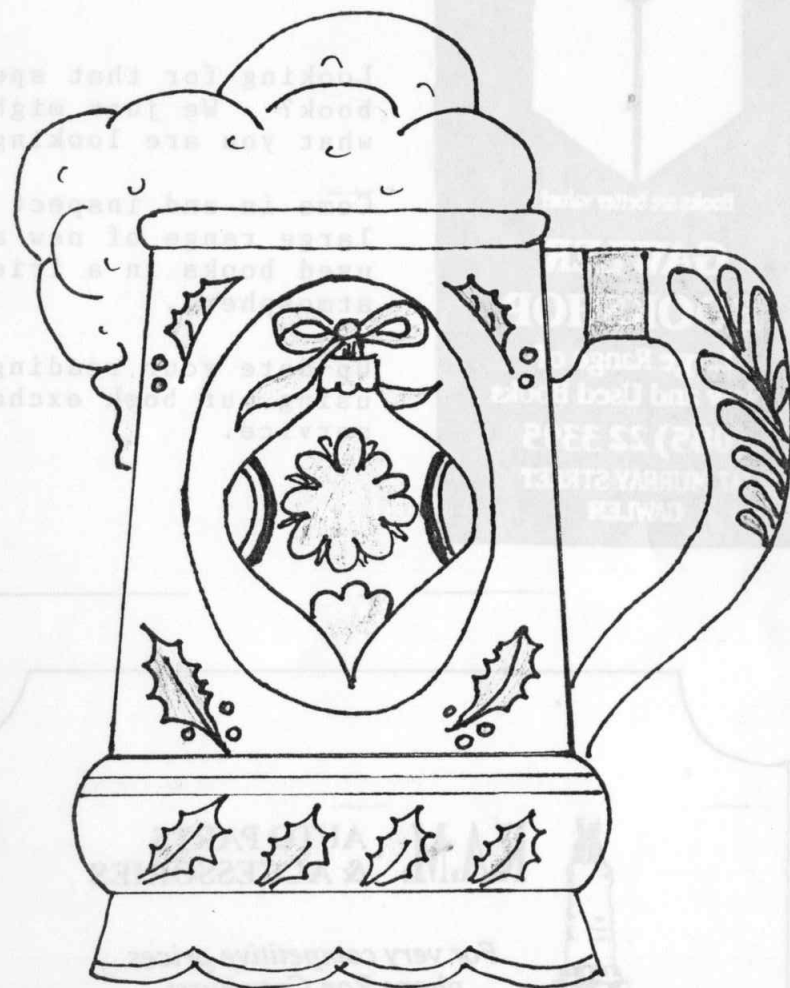

1994 has been both a year of change and consolidation for the Gawler C.M. Club. Changes have included new committee input, and a new venue with more space, bigger dance floor and ground level access.

Consolidation has taken place in the following areas -

The club policy of providing top quality entertainment at all shows, combined with friendly professional presentation has resulted in development of strong regular attendance, and a reputation as a good dance venue.

The continued development of the Gawler Festival into one of S.A's best.

Continued promotion of Club & Festival within Gawler and surrounding districts, and building of the Festival into one of Gawler's most important cultural & tourist events.
