From modest beginnings and the support of the community Barkuma Inc has become a member-based, not-for-profit organisation that believes society is enriched through the active inclusion of people of all abilities.

Established in 1967 by a group of parents in our northern suburbs, **Barkuma** has grown to employ more than 150 staff and provide services to over 1,000 people, making it one of the largest disability organisations in South Australia.

Services include open employment, supported employment, transition services, and community living support, along with training, counseling, advocacy and support.

'Our work is not possible without the acceptance of the community. So from all of us at Barkuma, thank you, for including people with a disability.'
