


Ever wanted to cook for yourself some of the yummy food you ate at the club show? Well Fiona has shared some of her recipes

QUICK QUICHE

This recipie is super easy and is a great was to use up eggs. It is also called Impossible quiche. This is something I make in advance and take it to work for my lunches. It's great hot or cold. The secret to this recipe is the pre cooked onions. I like to cook my onions first. Sometimes when you put raw onion into things it can stay raw. Plus it gives the quiche a completely different flavour.

3 small onions

- 1 Tablespoon margarine 5 bacon **\$** rashers
- 6 eggs
- 2 cups milk
- Salt and pepper to taste 1 cup grated tasty cheese 🧀
- 1 cup SR Flour
- 1 teaspoon mustard

Peel and dice the onion and fry off in the margarine until transparent. While the onions are cooking prepare the bacon. Cut off the fat and dice. You can really add anything so today I'm adding 1 cup mushrooms ⁴⁹ diced.


Add the eggs to a large bowl and whisk. Add milk, salt and pepper and the mustard and mix together. Now Add the SR Flour and whisk until lumps have reduced.

Add all the other ingredients and mix together.

Pour into an oiled quiche pan or oven dish. Cooking for around 40 minutes or until golden and set in 180°c preheated oven.

Serve immediately or allow to cool for the next day.







LEMONADE SCONES

I never thought of would give in and actually try this recipe because I love the old school recipe but here I am sharing this one with you. I think the taste is the same or at least very similar but I did find they are slightly fluffier and they did rise more too. They are "easier" to mix and this recipe make approx 10 to 12 depending on how big you make them.

3 cups S.R. Flour 1 cup cream, plus 300ml extra for topping 1 cup lemonade 1 Tablespoon icing sugar Jam of your choice to serve

Preheat oven to 180°C fan forced oven. Grease an oven tray approximately 23cm square. Sift the flour into a bowl and make a well in the centre.

Add the cream and lemonade to the flour and mix the ingredients together. Don't over mix it. Tip onto a floured surface and continue to combine. Flatten dough until roughly 3cm thick. Use a scone cutter or cookie cutter to cut out the scones and place side by side in prepared tray.

Bake 15 to 20 minutes or until golden brown and sound hollow when tapped. Allow to cool Use an electric mixer and beat the cream and icing sugar until it thickens. Serve scones with jam and cream

"Handle the dough as little as possible.

Scones are best made and eaten on the same day

Graeme Hugo (Australian Independent Artist)



Graeme began his Country Music Career back in Dec 1972 at the age of 18. During the following years he has toured not only his band (which he headlined for 20years) but Graeme toured throughout Australia several times with many high profile artists and remained an Independent Artist to this date. (50years on) Graeme has performed at many clubs around and one highlight was to open a shoe at the Sydney Opera House which he did on many occasions while on tour. Graeme has mentored many amateur artist and help them gain experience in the industry and one (Talia Whitman) won the prestigious Starmaker in Tamworth. Over the years he has helped raise money for the Isolated Children, Sids, Kids with Cancer, Aged Care, Angel Flight, variety of clubs as well as individual fund raising for people with personal illnesses within the

local communities. Past and present he still continues to raise money for the Royal Flying Doctor service and local AFM radio station. He has been heavily involved in hosting and assisting in running many Country Music Festivals in South Australia and still continues to give advice when requested. A few high light are below. 1992 released first Album ** 1993 Won the Tasmanian and New Zealand Songwriter Award ** 1994 Sami (Sth Aust Music Industry) award finalist and release of his second album " I'm Coming Through ". 1994 Golden Guitar Nominee (in Bush Ballad section) held in Tamworth NSW. **1997 Release of third album Like Father Like Son. ** 1997 Graeme received an Australia Day Award for his years of voluntary service to the outback communities. ** 1998 Received a Citizen of the year Award for his years of voluntary servicers to the outback communities. December 2001 till 2005 (at his and wife Lynne's home on Lincoln park Station) Graeme hosted and Co-Ordinated for the Spencer Gulf Country Music Festival (2 each year) raising monies for the Royal Flying Doctor Service. 2002 saw Graeme win the prestigious South Australia Council For Country Music . June 2003 Graeme was inducted into the Hands of Fame in SA. January 2005 hosted a coach to Tamworth Country Music Festival held in NSW. February 2005 he won the Victorian Lake Charlegrark Country Music Marathon "Outstanding Contribution Award" 2008 to current, Graeme began running entertainment for coach & club groups at a venue he set up and leases on the York peninsular in Sth Aust. 2009 Graeme won the 'People's Choice Award " most popular SA Country Music Artist. (Voted by the People in Clubs of SA. 2011 He released his 4th Album You Asked For It. He was also a Gold Medallion finalist - Media Awards - Male Vocal section, 2012 onwards to 2017 Graeme was nominated or won many awards. 2109-2021 not a lot happened due to Covid-19 Restrictions.

Graeme is one of Australia's most popular, hard working and successful Independent Artists with a natural appeal and rapport with audiences of all ages. He truly is a crowd pleaser and when performing never fails to give his all. He is acclaimed as S.A's Favourite Son and "The Voice" by media and fans alike owing to a clear and distinct voice, over which he has clear emotional control. Such voices are not common, but one such voice, however, does belong to Graeme Hugo, which has gained him both wide acclaim and industry recognition for his professionalism, enthusiasm, dedication, dynamic and unique contribution to the Country Music Industry. Years of constant travelling, 5 successful albums with number 6 in process, endless awards and accolades have well and truly earned Graeme a prominent place among the cream of Australian Country Music entertainers. Graeme is a popular Guest artist in all the South Australian Country Music Clubs. Well done Graeme we all appreciate your great talent.
