FIONN'S TUCKERBOX

JUNE SHOW.

All I can say is "WOW" what a super busy day we had in the kitchen. I'd like to thank you all for buying our meals and for all the wonderfully kind words you shared with us upon returning your plates/cutlery. I was experimenting with the replacement of the fish and chips option with my Tuna Mornay and it was very encouraging to hear the meals were enjoyed. We really do work extremely hard to make sure you have the best quality meal that we can provide.

There were 165 people that attended in June and it is really hard to judge how much food is needed each month. There is no way of knowing how many people will turn up on the day and this makes it difficult to cater. But I try my best to make sure everyone has a meal. The tricky part is needing to supply enough food for the busier days of 165 people but also the quieter days of 120 patrons and still make sure there's minimal food left over. The struggle is real and I stress each month on whether I have enough.

I am sorry if you missed out on one of my sandwiches, they sold out in record time. I supply the same amount of sandwiches each month and other months I may have a few left over at the end of the day but surprisingly this time they were the first things to go. I would suggest getting in quickly if you're attending the July show, so you don't miss out.

Matthew and I arrive at the club very early the day of the show to prepare all the veggies we serve to you. The sandwiches are made fresh the morning of the show, this way you get the best version of these fully loaded sandwiches.

It makes me giggle when I hear the things being said while Victoria is serving you. (My back is usually to you as I am dishing up the plates as they're ordered.)

"Nope, sorry we don't do small" Victoria's response (she really has adapted to our little family quite well.

I also noticed that people were still asking for hot food after 1pm. I understand that the line-up for food can be a little intimidating but I really must emphasize how important it is for us to turn off the fryer as early as possible to allow the oil to cool off so we can handle it safely whilst we are emptying the vessel. If we still have a line of people needing food at 12.30pm of course we will continue to cook, but it is important that we turn it off as soon as we can. As part of the conditions for hiring the kitchen space we are required to leave the space clean. We take it upon ourselves to always leave the kitchen cleaner than how we found it. So emptying the fryer and flushing it takes a fair bit of time in the cleaning process. Please be aware that I always clean the kitchen before we use it just in case it wasn't cleaned as thoroughly as we like it. Food safety is our priority.

We sometimes have left over food that is packed into take away containers that are available at a discounted price after the desserts have been served. Keep an eye on the serving counter for these cheap take home meals.
